The Albany Damien Center opened in 1988 and was incorporated in 1990 as the first AIDS drop-in center in the United States. Named after Saint Damien of Molokai, who ministered to people with leprosy in the 1800s, the Damien Center is not a faith-based organization, yet invites persons from all religious and spiritual paths to join in our efforts to participate in Damien Center services and activities.

HOUSING

100% Housing Retention

Of the **93 members** we provided with permanent supportive housing, **100%** remained housed or transitioned to permanent housing upon exit from our program. Further, **97%** of those members either maintained or increased their income in 2023.

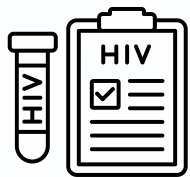

HIV CASCADE OF CARE

95% of Members Virally Suppressed

The HIV Treatment Cascade is a model that outlines the sequential steps of medical care that people go through from initial diagnosis to achieving the goal of viral suppression, and shows the proportion of individuals living with HIV who are engaged at each stage. The Damien Center's data-driven approach to programming allows us to achieve optimum outcomes for our members while adapting to new trends in care.



220 members with HIV actively served in 2023.



208 members with at least one viral load test this year.



198 members were virally suppressed.

We're proud that 95% of members reach viral suppression. The viral suppression average in New York State was 78% as of Dec 2022.



EMPLOYMENT PATHWAYS

163 Employment Services Provided

Employment Pathways provides our members with the support they need to pursue their career goals. For many of them making a difference in the communities they live in is a priority. We assist each person on their journey to fulfilling, paid employment and educational/vocational opportunities.



CENTER OF EXCELLENCE



The Albany Damien Center and the National Working Positive Coalition have combined our expertise to provide training and technical assistance to service providers throughout New York State to strengthen responses to needs for employment-related information, services and resources relating to those living with HIV. In 2023, we **provided 11 webinars and 2 in-person hybrid training courses** for **444 people statewide** using 8 curricula we developed.



BEHAVIORAL HEALTH

Connecting our members to a social network free of the stigma of HIV is key to our approach to behavioral health. The Damien Center itself is alive with support groups, meetings, social events and more. And there is always someone ready to lend a caring ear. In 2023, we **served 57 individuals** with **647 behavioral health sessions**.



PAWS PETS ARE WONDERFUL SUPPORT

In 2023, PAWS provided veterinary care assistance and made hundreds of home deliveries of pet food and supplies to ensure members stayed connected and pets stayed healthy.

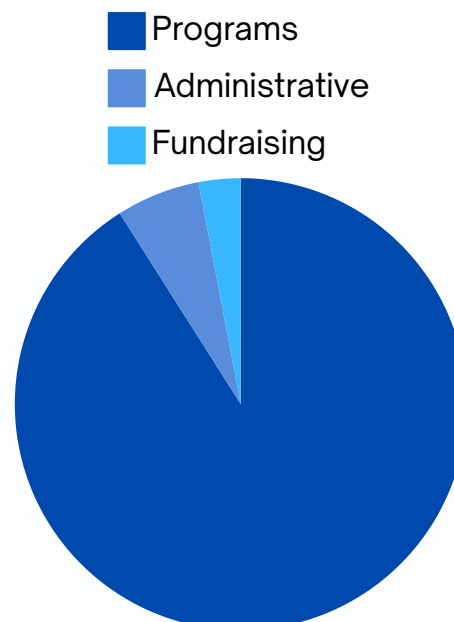

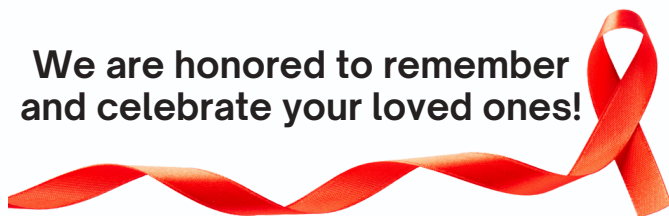
